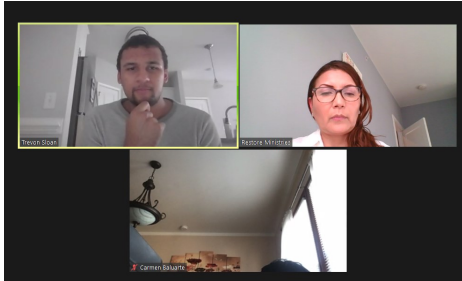

Volunteering - Alumni's Message

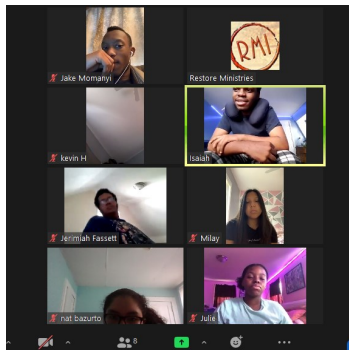


My name is Trevon Sloan, and I am a Chemical Engineer. I

members. Restore was a place for him to be a kid.

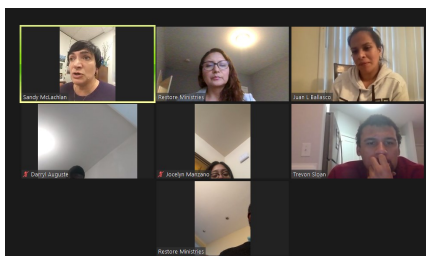

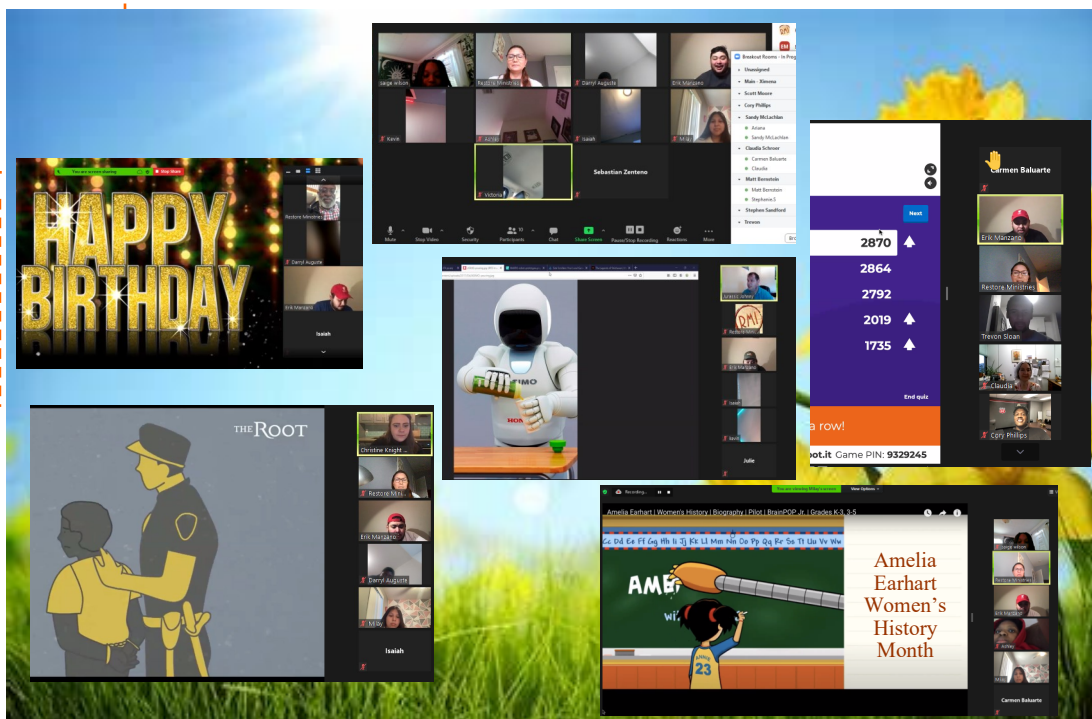
