I can't believe we are still dealing with COVID. Beyond basic concerns such as safety, a clean environment, enjoyable activities, and trained staff team, we are still dealing with the negative effects of the pandemic on the Restore community. In the past three years, members in our Restore family have experienced loss of jobs, academic learning loss, sickness, hospitalization, isolation, fear, and death of a close friend or a loved one. It hasn't been easy on us, parents, volunteers, and students.

Because of your faithful prayers, care, and financial support, Restore is resilient. Here are some of the things you made possible; Moving to our new program site at 42 Broad Street to meet in person once weekly. Offering amazing and cutting edge virtual

and programs.

But YOU are needed more than ever as we face the challenges of growing beyond our pre COVID attendance. Help us reach more children and teenagers in Restore, both in person and virtually. Restore Ministries is a positive influence in the lives of our youth and in the overall community by giving children and teenagers a safe place to go after school and offer extended learning opportunities outside of the classroom. However, recruiting and retaining students during the pandemic and now with its continual resurgence isn't easy.

We are hiring two part time staff in 2023. The first person, if all goes right within the hiring process should come on board in mid March. Generous grants from Provident Bank Foundation, The Westfield Foundation, and the Presbytery of the Northeast of

New Jersey are restricted for programs that will help us overcome the variety of obstacles we have to navigate through in order to increase membership and maintain program safety and quality. We cannot use these added funds for salary or overhead.

Your journey with us is an important resource and funding for the new staff team. The new staff will work closely with Ximena, Restore's Program Director. One of the tasks of the new role is to meet with school officials and parents about what they would like to see in an after school program and to visit successful after school programs to get a better idea of what does and doesn't work. Understanding what the community wants in an afterschool program and figuring out the best way to meet those needs is essential in the overall success of Restore.

Over the last 28 years you have proven our importance in the community and in the lives of our members and their families. With your help, we can expand to the hearts, minds, and lives of the many who will return after a long COVID nightmare and we will meet new students, parents and volunteers wanting to participate in the Restore community.

Thank you for your faithfulness to the vision and work that you are making possible for many in Elizabeth and its surrounding neighborhoods.

"Honor the Struggle and Move Forward"


Its been a challenging year. The transition to our new site is that it has limited space for physical activities and sports. The COVID drop in student attendance impacts the dynamics of the programs offered.

Despite all the struggles, we have remained positive, flexible, and willing to adapt to change. Staying flexible with an open mind is important. We are a small team of staff and volunteers so all of us learn to work outside of our job descriptions to achieve the goals. Achievements and improvements are made through teamwork. We are constantly adjusting.

When COVID struck we adapted by creating virtual and in person programs. We work hard to meet youth and parents' expectations by creating programs in a safe and healthy atmosphere.

Mondays is our face-to-face meetings, where homework help and the Arts in all forms (visual, arts and craft, performance, digital, and more) happens. Currently, everyone is learning Dance and Fashion Design. The Institute of Music for Children provides the art activities.

Tuesday is virtual. The students sign in at their homes. They call themselves Students United for Justice (SUFJ). SUFJ is an eight week learning module. This academic year students were engaged with issues such as Food Insecurity, Disability Justice and Access, and Environmental Justice.



The learning modules are taught by Incredible Days Group.

We end the week with Gratitude Thursdays. The focus remains on homework help. We also emphasize relationship building and fun social and educational activities. Our High school and college students lead those group activities.

Restore has a set of unique programs to offer to children, teenagers and young adults. We are focused on increasing our impact.
