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Restore now has three after-school sites in Elizabeth that result from our partnership with two Elizabethport communities. One of these communities, Elizabethport Presbyterian Center, has been a partner for fifteen-plus years, and now Restore is part of its Wednesday after-school program. Restore's newly hired Antoine Nelson works at this new site. In addition to EPC, Antoine is working with Ximena, Restore's Program Director, in the midtown section on Mondays, virtually on Tuesdays, and at another location in the Elizabethport neighborhood on Thursdays. This expansion has the potential to extend Restore's impact and outreach within the city of Elizabeth while also increasing its membership.

It hasn't been easy recovering from COVID. Our struggles have included redirecting our limited funding and finding new donors, which has allowed Restore to hire new, much-needed staff. On the other hand, each gain has created some unexpected setbacks. For example, our former site, which is no longer available, was so perfect for Restore. Although the new space is great, our meetings at this location are restricted to once weekly. An additional setback includes reduced student involvement. Specifically, students who used to be involved are not coming anymore; some are now high school graduates, some are employed part-time, while others found different interests during COVID. Other challenges include that new visitors at Restore, at times, aren't always sure what to do --- or if they belong. Additionally, not only are volunteers in short in supply, but some of those who are current, are exhausted and burned out. It's also been so hard to find youth workers. Over all, the general sentiment seems to be that the world doesn't look or sound safe. Not one of our lives is the same.

There never was or will be a "return to normal" ...constant interruptions in personal, ministry, and civic life leaves many of us tired and some of us burned out. Yet, a post-COVID world requires that pandemic sequalae neither define who we are nor what we do. Instead, relationships continue to be the key that brings children and teenagers to Restore meetings. As Restore looks forward, we strive to connect with children and teenagers four times during the week. Additionally, we want to reinstate the following: honor roll field trips, Christmas holiday gifts, and investing and nurturing the unique talents and gifts of its members. Restore is the after-school place where city kids find out who they are, what they're designed to do while mustering the courage and knowledge to move forward in their lives.
