# REALIZING POTENTIAL ..MAXIMIZING ACHIEVEMENT FROM THE FOUNDER AND CEO

The Restore Board deeply appreciates the 2024 support we received from our volunteers, partners and donors. Because your time and resources were generously given, our members and their families received services and programs that helped them move into hope-filled futures. God's love is being shared, and new possibilities have been extended within the cities of Elizabeth, Linden, Union, and Roselle. You're truly transforming lives!

I marvel at your generosity and faithfulness towards the Restore Ministries community. Each year there is a request form completed by you to participate in fulfilling the goals and finances; I'm always amazed by your positive response. Together, here are some of our major accomplishments:

- 1. Three Restore Ministries' alumni have graduated this year from Kean University and NJIT.
- 2. Our 2024 high school graduates are now first-year students at two and four-year colleges and trade schools.
- 3. Our 2024 high school graduates who did not pursue higher education are gainfully employed
- 4. The Arts Community Enrichment (A.C.E.) summer day camp expanded from 37 participants in 2023 to 75 participants in 2024 an increase of 100%!
- 5. Restore members have three opportunities to connect with us during the school year: Monday at the Snyder Academy in Midtown Elizabeth, Tuesday online at Students United for Justice, and Thursday at the Miller-Evans-Logan Recreation Center in the Elizabethport section of Elizabeth.

You have made all of this and so much more possible. You remain a vital part of Restore Ministries' success. Yet, the challenges in 2025 are genuine while young people and their families continue to count on the support you give year after year. One of these challenges: in




2024, the City of Elizabeth graciously awarded Restore Ministries a one-time grant of \$30,000, which was in addition to their annual support. These grant monies enabled the increased participation at Arts Community Enrichment (A.C.E.) summer day camp. After this success, I hope we do not have to go backwards. Therefore, my prayer includes new funds that will replace this \$30,000 by July 1, 2025. These replacement funds will allow Restore to continue the increased rate of participation at A.C.E. summer day camp in 2025. My second prayer: to complete Restore's third mission and service trip in 2025. Our most recent trip, in 2022, was to Mississippi. In 2025, Washington, D.C. would be a great location for Restore's mission and service trip, despite the estimated price tag: \$7,500.00.

Please continue to support Restore Ministries with 2025 contributions and your prayers. We look forward to our continued partnership and promise to keep you up-to-date on our great work in the lives of young people. Together, we are giving city youth the means for envisioning a bright future, setting challenging and realistic goals and, ultimately, finding their path to success.

The last thirty years have been possible because parents trust us, annual youth participation, and because of all our donors and supporters - like you - who volunteer, pray and provide Restore's financial backbone.


